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A Proclamation of The City of Ridgecrest, California AVIATION ORDNANCE DAY

WHEREAS, on a date lost in history, a young marine handed a grenade to a pilot who subsequently deployed it during a combat mission in the First World War; and,

WHEREAS, a Chief Gunners Mate, a Chief Turret Captain, and several Mechanics were sent forth to pioneer the Navy's first Advanced Aircraft Armament and Ordnance System in Pensacola, Florida; and,

WHEREAS, The California Grand Jury is an arm of the Superior Court; and,


WHEREAS, on the 2nd day of March, 1926 the United States Navy declared the establishment of the Aviation Ordnance Rating and all four petty officer grades of Chief, First, Second, and Third Class and the Aviation Ordnance specialty mark, a winged flaming spherical shell, was incorporated into the Uniform Regulations in January 1927; and,

WHEREAS, the establishment of the Association of Aviation Ordnancemen in 1976 leading to the first annual convention in San Diego, CA. formally opening membership to all Navy and Marine Corps ordnanceman past, present, and future.; and,

WHEREAS, transferred to the United States Navy in November 1943 by the United States Army Air Forces, at the conclusion of the search for an adequate ordnance testing facility by Charles C. Lauritsen and Sherman E. Burroughs. Naval Ordnance Test Station was founded. Leading to the development of an array of airworthy conventional rockets and missiles to include the AIM-9, SLAM-ER, Tiny Tim Rocket Unit, and much more, Naval Air Weapons Station China Lake has been "the home of ordnance".

Now, Therefore, The Ridgecrest City Council Hereby Proclaims the day of March 2, 2023 as "AVIATION ORDNANCE DAY" and asks all citizens of Ridgecrest to join with the Association of Aviation Ordnanceman's 5th Chapter in carrying the message and recognition of the tasks and hardships carried out and endured by naval ordnance men and women, ordnance handlers, engineers and scientists aboard NAWS China Lake, Air Test & Evaluation Squadron Nine, Air Test & Evaluation Squadron Thirty One, NAWS China Lake Weapons Department, Explosive Ordnance Disposal Detachments and other associated military and civilian components, that have led to the progression and advancement of conventional weapons testing capabilities, ordnance and armament systems, procedures, training, and tactics for the fleet.



SUBJECT: A Resolution Of The Ridgecrest City Council To Appropriate A Portion Of The American Rescue Plan Act Funds To Add Shade Structures Over The Spectator Seating At The Kerr McGee Youth Sports Complex Baseball And Football Field

SUMMARY:

On March 11, 2021, President Biden signed into law the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), which provides one-time fiscal relief funds to State and Local Governments and other program areas aimed at mitigating the continuing effects of the COVID-19 Pandemic. ARPA includes State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds to support urgent COVID response efforts to decrease the spread of the virus and to replace lost public sector revenue to strengthen support for vital public services. The City of Ridgecrest's allocation of direct local stimulus is \$6,930,958, with the first 50% paid to the City in July of 2021 and the remaining balance in July of 2022.

The United States Treasury has adopted the SLFRF final rule, along with a list of Frequently Asked Questions, as guidance regarding the use of ARPA funds. The allowed uses of ARPA funding focus on four key program areas: to respond to the public health emergency or its negative economic impacts, including assistance to households, small businesses, and nonprofits, or aid to impacted industries such as tourism, travel, and hospitality; to respond to workers performing essential work during COVID-19; for the provision of government service to the extent of the reduction in revenue due to COVID-19; and to make necessary investments in water, sewer or broadband infrastructure. The use of ARPA funds is retroactive to March 3, 2021. All funds must be obligated by December 31, 2024, and must be spent by December 31, 2026.

The City staff brought to council during a workshop on November 17, 2021 a list of recommended projects for the use of appropriations. These projects were discussed with council, community members as well as City staff.

Recommendations for Appropriations at the time:

The Kerr McGee Youth Sports Complex is rented 9 months out of the year to IWV Youth Baseball and is used for practices, games and tournaments. The dual-purpose field is rented at least 7 months out of the year to IWV Youth Soccer and is used for practices and games. Currently, there is no shade over the spectator seating at any of these fields. During the multiple seasons the temperature can often reach into the triple digits and including shade over these areas allows extended use of the complex and encourages additional support of these organizations from the community. The Kerr McGee Sports Complex serves well over 400 families during these leagues and shade has been a topic of concern brought forward.

The Parks and Recreation Department is requesting \$559,878.21 in American Rescue Plan Act funds to install 11 shade structures over the spectator seating at the Kerr McGee Youth Sports Complex baseball fields and dual-purpose field, this includes a 15% contingency for any unforeseen during the project.

1. Authorize the allocation of \$559,878.21 in the American Rescue Plan Act funds for installation of spectator seating shade at the Kerr McGee Youth Sports Complex.
2. Authorize the City Manager to sign project agreements.

This project will be completed using the pre-negotiated purchasing contract. The price quotes given are good until March 31, 2023 as long as the City has a fully executed agreement before then.

This Project was brought back to the Quality of Life Committee on February 7, 2023 for discussion and they recommended moving this project forward for council approval.

Staff is requesting that City Council approve this ARPA project and authorized Finance Director to allocate the funds from the ARPA allocation and allow City Manager Ron Strand to sign the contract.

ARPA Justification: FAQ 4.2: “Under (603)(c)(1)(C), recipients may use funds for maintenance of infrastructure or pay-go spending for building of new infrastructure as part of the general provision of government services, to the extent of the estimated reduction in revenue due to the public health emergency.”

FISCAL IMPACT:

\$559,878.21 of the \$6,930,958 allocated American Rescue Plan Act Funds that includes a project contingency.

SUBJECT: Proposed Approval Of Additional American Rescue Plan Act Funds For A Construction Contingency Not To Exceed \$5,000 For The Replacement Of The Park Roofs Located At The Leroy Jackson Sports Complex And Upjohn Park

PRESENTED BY: Nerissa Wegener, Parks and Recreation Director

SUMMARY:

On February 1, 2023, the City Council approved the increased appropriations in the amount of \$6,922 for the roofs on the concession building located at Leroy Jackson Sports Complex, and the restroom building and gazebo located at Upjohn Park (resolution #22-08). During this process the roofing company came back with some additional repairs that weren't listed on the original estimate, therefore staff is requesting a construction contingency to cover these unexpected costs. When the budget for this project was approved a contingency was not included.

After the removal from both structures, the roofer discovered water damaged fascia board and existing particle board roofing decking on the "Monitor" center roof sections on both structures located at Upjohn Park. The particle board roof decking does not have the required density needed to hold the fasteners that attach the metal roof system. New CDX plywood will need to be install over both raised "Monitor" roof areas.

The Fascia and border boards on both "Monitor" roof areas is water damaged and need to be replaced with new fascia and border boards.

Staff recommend that The City Council approve the increase in ARPA funds and authorize the Finance Director to allocate the funds from the ARPA allocation to cover a Construction Contingency not to exceed \$5,000.

FISCAL IMPACT: Allocated increase in ARPA funding for Construction Contingency not to exceed \$5,000.

1. The Ridgecrest City Council does hereby approve the additional appropriation of a portion of the American Rescue Plan Act Funds in the amount not to exceed

- \$5,000 to cover a Construction Contingency for the roofs at Leroy Jackson Sports Complex and Upjohn Park; and,
2. Authorize the Finance Director to amend the FY23 budget.
