 - Only 2 are connected to the Agency
 - Roof and AC need extensive attention, repairs and replacement or maintenance
 - The buyer will provide an anchor business to connect with other businesses and Ole Towne

- Noted all the services provided by the Kern County Sheriffs
- Gets approximately 2% of the calls in Kern County
- Made Mike Scott Senior Officer and assigned him to the City where he lives
- You have a Supervisor who cares more for your city than any of the other supervisors
- You will not get better representation than

Fire Chief Thompson

- Has been working very hard to update agreements since 1984
- Has been with Kern County Fire for 35 years
- Long process and looked at all factors
- Counties that provide services to cities put most of the costs to the cities
- Met with all the city managers in Kern County
- Took suggestions to the Board of Supervisors
- Explained how the fees were arrived at
- Agreement has been approved by the City and will go to the Supervisors next week
- A copy with city signatures and his was left with the clerk
- Listed the number of fire stations, equipment and personnel resources of the fire department and their deployment
- He is also the Emergency Operations Services Director for the County

Waste Management Director Daphne Harley

- Provides trash services to Kern County and the 11 incorporated cities
- Also provides hazardous wastes disposal services
- Eliminated bun dumps and establish landfills
- Closure caps on landfills
- Establishing transfer stations
- Habitat conservation plan
- Diversion / recycling program at least 50% of the waste
- Transfer and disposal of the waste
- Revenues generated by gate and disposal fees
- Land use fee charged on each residential property on tax fee
- Gate fees for non residential waste
- Bin fees - bins provided by trash company

Jon McQuiston

- Listed several facts about Inyo County
- One of poorest counties in the state
- Approximately 18k population
- Their water sources have been and still is siphoned off to southern California
- Both boards would have to adopt resos for secession
- District would be redrawn
- Inyokern Airport would lose commercial air transport
- Would impact the Navy base
- Inyo County has volunteer fire department could not respond to fire at airport
- Most travelers at airport are for the base

Sincerely urged council to not consider secession

- Would like to mend any relationships we might have damaged
- Hopefully we can do that and proceed again on doing good things
